Progress

In December 2010, our Field worker visited two families to find out how receiving a goat has made a difference to their lives.

Didier, our Field Worker, visited the home of Mukamatwara Renatha and Mukeshimana Liberatha, two girls who live with their grandparents. There, he met the girls' uncle who said that before receiving the goat in 2009, their crops didn't always grow well. Now they use the goat manure as fertiliser and the harvests are good. The family has enough food to eat and sometimes some left over to sell. The goat has already given birth and the uncle explained that after they give one kid back to Aid for Education, they will sell some of the others to earn money.

Africa Amos lives with his mother and two sisters. His mother is a farmer and was given a goat in April 2010. She said that the manure from the goat helps her crops grow so she can feed her children. The goat is about to give birth. Amos's mother said that she will sell some of the kids to buy what she needs.

The goat is very important for any family in Rwanda, especially for the poor. The manure can fertilise the crops, which the family can sell to buy what they need. The family may eat the goats and sometimes they use the milk to feed their babies.
